Call for Proposals

PennTESOL East invites you to submit proposals to our Fall Event. This year's theme is ***Teaching Speaking to the Multilingual Students of Today's World.***

At this year's event, we want to reflect on and consider how we can most effectively theorize and teach speaking with our multilingual learners. You may address any of the below questions in your presentation or identify a topic of your own in relation to this year's theme:

- How might we create safe spaces that allow students to make mistakes, take risks, engage in thoughtful communicative acts, and be curious when learning to speak English?
- How might we model speaking in ways that advance students' learning?
- What are best practices for scaffolding speaking (e.g. think-pair-share or talking heads)?
- How do we embrace technology and other multiple modes to teach speaking?
- How do you create engagement in your speaking courses?
- How might we use students' linguistic and educational experiences to teach speaking?

We invite you to submit proposals to share your ideas, insights, research, and strategies so that we can all learn together, harness our collaborative efforts, and make commitments that move teaching towards a more just future. We welcome proposals from teaching professionals at all levels and encourage graduate student submissions.

You will be notified on or before October 31 regarding whether your presentation has or has not been accepted. To ensure a place on the schedule, accepted presenters must be PennTESOL-East members and registered for the conference by November 3, 2022.

30-Minute Presentations

These are oral presentations, in which presenters share their ideas, experiences, perspectives, and expertise. Presentations may be grounded in research, practice, or policy, or theory. Presentations may include audience participation and dialogue. Please note that there will be no breakout sessions for this event, and **only two 30-minute presentations will be selected.**

Poster Sessions

Posters can present either results of completed research or work in progress. We especially welcome poster proposals that (a) report on innovative research that is in its early phases, or (b) report on a successful classroom activity. The poster should contain a summary of an academically sound, scholarly or creative project presented in a visually engaging format, highlighting work through charts, graphs, maps, etc. Poster presenter(s) should plan on engaging in short, informative discussions with convention attendees throughout the entire poster session. When planning your poster, keep in mind that the audience should be able to understand the poster's concept even if the presenter is not standing beside the display. Poster proposals should include the main topic and a description of the visual display. **Posters should be no larger than 48" x 36".**
